

Comin' Out of the Cage Music, et al., Case No. 3:01-0697.

Accordingly, the Clerk is **directed** to file the Plaintiffs' Motion for Reconsideration in that case. The plaintiffs have filed a Plaintiffs' Motion for Reconsideration in other cases. These notices of filing shall be docketed in the cases in which the original motion was filed with reference to the appropriate docket number in the case of 3:01-0697, rather than 3:01-0412.

If a notice of filing of plaintiffs' motion for reconsideration is filed in a case number in which an original motion was not filed, the Clerk shall return that notice to the plaintiff without docketing it.¹


Upon consideration of the plaintiffs' motion for reconsideration, the motion is **GRANTED in part**. Provided the plaintiffs use personal service so that the time for response will be twenty (20) days after service, the plaintiffs may have until **October 29, 2001**, to complete service of process.²

¹Although not specifically required by the Rules, the parties in this litigation are requested to include their telephone number in their signature block.

²The plaintiffs' motion requested an additional 15 day extension but then proposed October 31, 2001, which would be 16 days. The Magistrate Judge believes that a two-week extension is adequate.
