


ORDER

Only United States Marshals, Deputy U.S. Marshals, Court Security Officers, Federal Protective Service Officers and U.S. Probation Officers are authorized to carry firearms, dangerous weapons, chemical irritants, conducted energy weapons or stun guns, and impact weapons in and around the Federal court facilities of the Middle District of Tennessee as defined by 18 U.S.C. § 930(g)(3). No other law enforcement officer, state or federal, shall enter these facilities in possession of any of the aforementioned firearms or weapons unless the same is, or is expected to be, an exhibit in a case, or unless such law enforcement officer is responding to an emergency, is under escort by the U.S. Marshals Service or Federal Protective Service, is in the process of escorting a prisoner to the U.S. Marshals Service's cellblock, or is in the process of transporting a prisoner before a United States Magistrate Judge or United States District Judge under the supervision of the U.S. Marshal Service. All firearms and weapons to be used as evidence in a case must be secured, made safe and inspected by the U.S. Marshals Service before being brought into any courtroom.


This Administrative Order supersedes and renders null and void Administrative Order No. 116, entered by the Court on April 18, 2005.
