ORDER


To encourage the limited practice of law by law students in Tennessee before this Court, this Order shall apply.

Any law student who is in good standing with and currently enrolled in a Tennessee law school legal clinic or externship program may with the written consent of the dean of his or her law school be eligible to practice in this Court on a case-by-case basis, subject to the following:

1. Each law student shall practice through a supervising attorney, who shall be the attorney of record, assume professional responsibility for the law student's work, sign all filings, be present in Court during any appearance the law student makes, and be prepared to respond to any inquiry by the Court and supplement any statement by the student.
2. An eligible law student may appear on behalf of the following parties: (1) any indigent person, with that person's written consent; or (2) the United States, with the written consent of the United States Attorney.
3. Law students may appear in criminal matters only in pretrial proceedings before a Magistrate Judge or in petty offense matters as set out in this Order.
4. The Dean of the law school must certify to the Court that the student is of good moral character and competent legal ability. The Dean of the law school may withdraw the student's certification at any time.
5. The supervising attorney shall move for permission from the Judge or Magistrate Judge before whom the law student will appear prior to any in-court appearance by the student. Granting permission for a law student to appear shall be at the discretion of the District Judge or Magistrate Judge, and the District Judge or Magistrate Judge may terminate the student's privileges under this rule at any time.
6. The law student shall not seek or receive compensation from the individual or party on whose behalf the student renders legal assistance. The law student may receive academic credit or a stipend from the law school and may be compensated by an employer.

7. A copy of this Order shall be served on the Dean of all Tennessee law schools.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 155

ORDER

It is hereby ORDERED that law students enrolled in a legal clinic program at a law school accredited by the American Bar Association and the Association of American Law Schools in the State of Tennessee may appear before this Court on behalf of any indigent person in a civil action, provided that the law student is under the immediate personal supervision of an attorney who has been admitted to practice in this Court and has been approved by the Dean of the law school to instruct and supervise law students. The attorney providing such supervision shall sign all papers to be filed with the Court and shall be present in Court during the student's appearance.

Before any student shall be eligible to appear in Court, the Dean of his or her law school and the Director of the legal clinic program shall file with the United States District Court Clerk for the Middle District of Tennessee a list of students who are to participate and certify to the Court that those students are of good moral character and have met the following requirements:

- (a) the law student has successfully completed two academic years of course credit, or the equivalent, toward a J.D. degree;

- (b) the law student has successfully completed at least six quarter hours or four semester hours of civil procedure;
- (c) the law student has successfully completed at least three quarter hours or two semester hours of evidence;
- (d) the law student has successfully completed or is in the process of taking a professional responsibility course;
- (e) the individual law student meets all of the requirements of Rule 7, Section 10.03 of the Rules of the Tennessee Supreme Court.




